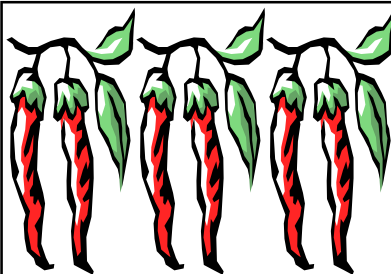

Mt Zion's Faith Partners recovery support ministry invites you to its monthly Discussion Forum on topics of interest to help, healing and support for substance abuse recovery. Discussions always include frank presentations followed by candid interchange.

October 20: ***Our Toxic Teen Culture***. The social world youth face today is full of dangers, including underage drinking. Many of today's parents and families feel isolated and helpless while others may be unaware that their attitudes and beliefs actually contribute to dangerous environments for youth. Pat Guliani, from the **Cobb Alcohol Task Force**, will present on and discuss the **Safe Neighborhoods/Safe Homes** program. We'll see ways to remove the parenting in isolation and empower participating residents to stop the dangerous health and safety incidents resulting from underage drinking parties/gatherings. Even if your family chooses not to use alcohol or other drugs, youth come into contact with others who do. There are tools to help you help your youth limit their social exposure to underage drinking by others. Remember that even if there are no youth living in your home, it is not only the underage drinker who is "at-risk;" there are dangerous second hand effects for by-standers and the community too.

Youth in our community deserve all of our efforts to help keep both them and our neighborhoods and communities safe. This presentation and discussion is open to all, both congregation and community. Join us Tuesday, October 20th, 7:00 p.m. in Room 27, to learn more about these issues, ways they're being addressed and how we can provide a compassionate response.

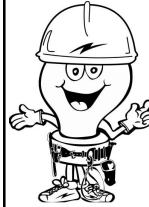

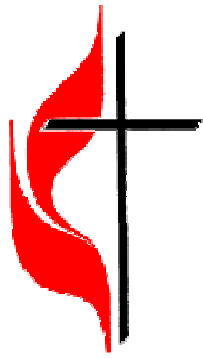
